Hello Healey'ers!

As we approach Christmas and 2013 draws to a close, I wanted to get you advance notice of events and dates for the 2014 season. The Committee have met twice since the AGM in October and have pretty-well squared away the events diary for the coming season. It's going to be a busy year!

2013 has been an interesting and largely successful year, both for our Centre and the Austin-Healey marque in general. It was pleasing to report that for the first time in many years (ever?) South Western has passed the 200 member mark – great news! At a time when many clubs are reducing in numbers and struggling to survive, it is a good sign. That said, we cannot be complacent of course and a strong calendar – with varied and interesting events – and good communications are surely at the heart of a strong membership.

More generally it will not have escaped you I'm sure that the Austin Healey has been very well reported in the motoring press this year. I think all of the National classic car publications have run major articles on our cars and there has been much publicity surrounding a number of special cars, NOJ392's sale to name but one. Healeys are seemingly 'of the moment' and increasingly desirable cars and values are climbing as a result. That's largely good news although it does mean that they are already or will be out of the reach of many prospective owners. Two 100Ms have recently sold at just under/over £150k, the 100S is already well over £500k and 'ordinary' Healey prices are rising steadily. Indeed, some suggest that good, original RHD 100/4s will soon be £100k cars! One of the big benefits we have is the Sprite – what better car to offer affordable entry into Austin-Healey ownership? There is a strong will – led by the FBHVC - to foster the next generation of classic car owners and we need to play our part in bringing new, younger members into the AHC. It was disappointing, I feel, that the AHC was not at the forefront of the recently announced young classic driver's insurance scheme and this point was raised at the recent National AGM.

2014 is an 'even' year and that means it is a Le Mans Classic year! If you have not yet been, it is a great weekend away, relatively close and easy to get to and just an amazing mix of on-track action – nearly 400 cars race – and club stands. Last year, for the first time, the LMC was full – nearly 7000 classic car club cars! You will see the notice in the January Revcounter but do email me if you are interested in going as I will be putting in an entry.

Enough I think – you'll have better things to do than read my ramblings! So, all it remains for me to do as we close another busy year is to wish you all, on behalf of the Committee, a very Happy Christmas and a prosperous and enjoyable 2014!
